

## Dear Prescriber,

The NDSU Departments of Pharmacy Practice and Public Health would like to inform you of an initiative that is taking place in North Dakota. Pharmacies in your area are currently participating in an intervention focused on prescription opioid harm reduction for patients served who are prescribed an opioid. This intervention is focused on opioid and naloxone patient education (ONE Program). At the time a patient presents an opioid prescription to the pharmacy, the ONE Program utilizes a screening tool assisting pharmacists in stratifying the risks for opioid misuse and/or opioid overdose. This screening tool, which is completed by the patient in the pharmacy, gathers objective measures that optimize patient focused pharmacy interventions to minimize negative opioid outcomes. Examples of interventions include, but are not limited to, education about opioid use disorder and support resource information, promoting 'Medication Take Back' at the pharmacy locations, education on signs/symptoms of opioid overdose, and naloxone dispensing for patients at risk for opioid overdose.

The ONE Program team has provided outreach support and education to the pharmacies around the state and we would also like to offer our contact information if providers have additional questions. While the ONE Program is an intervention that promotes a tailored pharmacy care approach, we invite you to partner with the pharmacists in your community to ensure opioid risks are minimized and positive outcomes are attained.
